Resources for personal prayer

While we may not be able to meet for regular worship there are many resources which we can use to maintain times of prayer and bible study.

The Book of Common Prayer offers prayers and readings for all occasions and the orders of Morning and Evening Prayer can be read aloud in one's own home. The Psalter which is included in the Book of Common Prayer identifies a psalm or selection of psalms for each day of the month.

Radio and television

The BBC offers a **Daily Service** on Radio 4 Long Wave every day at 9.45am as well as **Sunday Worship** at 8.10am on Sunday mornings on Radio 4. There is **Choral Evensong** on Radio 3 every Wednesday at 3.30pm which is repeated on Sundays at 3.00pm. In addition, **Songs of Praise** is televised on BBC1 at 1.15pm on Sunday. Programmes are also available on BBC iPlayer or the BBC Sounds app.

Digital Resources

There are several apps available for smartphones and tablets including the Church of England **Daily Prayer** app which offers Morning Prayer, Evening Prayer and Compline in either Contemporary or Traditional Language. **Time to Pray** similarly offers an Order for Prayer During The Day as well as an order for Night Prayer. The app **Pray as you go** offers a short daily audio meditation with music. The Church of England publishes a **Prayer for the Day** both as audio and text on its website as well as on several social media platforms. Many Church of England resources can be accessed through **smart speakers** such as Alexa or Google home by asking 'Alexa open The Church of England' or 'Hey Google, talk to the Church of England.' As well as answering questions, the apps can be asked to read a range of prayers along with such things as the Apostle's Creed and The Beatitudes.

Chester Cathedral will provide worship through online streaming at 5.30pm on Mondays, Tuesdays and Thursdays and at 10am on Sundays.

There are many Bible Study resources available as apps or on the web. The ones which we have mainly been using for Exploring the Word of God can be found on the following websites:

Thought for the month

Sundays in Isolation

I wonder where you have been worshipping recently. As I write this we have just experienced the tenth Sunday with churches closed for services. I imagine most of us who are used to attending church regularly will have tried to fill the gap in some way or another. Or maybe not. It might have felt like a great relief not to have to get up on a Sunday morning to play one's part as sidesperson, lesson reader or coffee provider. After all, we have now learnt that worship can happen without the building, maybe it can happen without us too.

Having said that, the scope for engaging in worship has become enormous. I don't think I have ever celebrated Easter so thoroughly before. I must have spent the whole day at a service of one kind or another. I have modified my intake a bit since but I am still finding that I pack much more worship into my Sunday.

Where have I found my services? The BBC Radio 4 Sunday Worship was part of my regular Sunday routine in any case. For my main morning service it has been a choice between Sunday Worship on BBC1 or the live streaming of the Eucharist from Chester Cathedral – the choice based to some extent on where the BBC service was televised from. I still think of St David's Cathedral as my mother church. For me though, the main joy has been the ability to worship virtually in my mother tongue, and as the day goes on I engage with hymns, prayers and meditations from a range of Welsh speaking churches of all denominations, taking me back to the roots of my faith through Facebook. Finally, I end my Sunday with Compline over a telephone conference led by one of my Reader colleagues.

It is not to say that this plethora of opportunity isn't a matter for debate. There have been quite fierce arguments about whether this is the way of doing church for the future. While some clergy seem desperate to reopen their buildings others cite the numbers recorded at their YouTube videos as a good reason never to worship in a building again. So where will we end up?

I don't think we can tell. After all, as we are reminded at this time of year, the Holy Spirit gets involved. I doubt the first disciples ever saw themselves rushing out to speak in the streets of Jerusalem after they had been hiding in the upper room (Acts 2) but that was the beginning of what we now call church. So, as we envision the nature of church after lockdown, perhaps we should just pray that, whatever the form, our worship is, as it is meant to be, a channel for the Holy Spirit to work in us and in our world. **Ann**

We have wonderful memories of our time spent with you, our Lower and Over Peover family, and I thank you for those years. I hope it may be possible to have a thanksgiving service at Lower Peover when we are once again allowed back into our churches.

It is with sadness we report the death of Reverend Kenneth Burghall.

As a brief history of his life he was born in 1934 and spent his younger days in the Chester area. He attended Selwyn college Cambridge and Queens college Birmingham, gaining BA in 1957 and MA in1963. Ken was Priested in 1960 being at St Michaels Macclesfield from 1959 to 1963. Following St Michaels Macclesfield he became an Army Chaplain 1963 to 1967.

His priesthood then continued at St. Marks Birkenhead 1967 to 1971, then to St. Pauls Macclesfield until 1987 when he moved to Lower Peover. In 1992 Lower Peover and Over Peover became a joint benefice.

His time in Lower Peover was a very busy period. Under his ministry the Church became a focal point for Peover and the wider community. Along with the three Sunday services and two mid-week communion services, daily 7am services were introduced which drew a small but regular number of worshippers. There was also a focus placed on the social aspects of ministry which developed a wider involvement and under his leadership the Church thrived. This enabled the Church to become financially stable and also enabled extensive building renovation works to be undertaken, ensuring a sound future for the parish.

Ken was a man who could easily be described as "one of life's characters". He could often be found in the Church (and often with Maureen) in the early hours of the morning preparing for a service or festival. He was a real conversationalist, and would keep any individual, group or dinner party entertained for whatever time was available with stories on many topics from wartime Gas busses in Chester to matters of faith. His knowledge and ability to recall dates, events and people was legendary. One of his special birthday celebrations was a day out in a Rolls Royce organised by a group of parishioners, which he thoroughly enjoyed. His arrangements for the many parish coach trip outings were always interesting and always involved food. His great loves outside his devoted Parish life were of course his family followed closely by cricket and steam trains.

The Parish registers will show he carried out extensive work under the heading of "occasional offices". Lower Peover became a very popular Church for weddings, not just for the building but for the welcome and support shown to couples, and as a natural progression many baptisms followed. Due to his welcoming approach Ken was called upon by many in times of difficulty and was known to be very generous with his time and effort to assist. Many families were also helped in times of bereavement. His ministry was greatly appreciated by many and he was very greatly missed on his retirement.

Following his retirement from Lower Peover in 2004, Rev. Burghall went to live in Congleton and continued ministry at various churches in the Macclesfield and Congleton area, filling in during interregnums and incumbents' holidays etc. He also officiated at many funerals and other services.

During his recent time in hospital he celebrated his 86th birthday and also his and Maureen's 59th Wedding anniversary.

Unfortunately, due to the Covid 19 restrictions a formal funeral was not possible, and a private burial took place at Henbury Church. It is planned to hold a service at Lower Peover when matters return to normal. There was a large gathering on the road outside the Church, the internment being conducted by Bishop William Pwaisiho, formerly of Gawsworth.

We should also remember Maureen Burghall at this time. Whist without a formal appointment in Lower Peover her work and support in many ways in the parish was extensive. Our sympathy is extended to Maureen at this sad time, and also to Christopher (son) and Sharon (daughter) and their families.

Charles Dickens - prolific writer with a social conscience

Victorian novelist Charles Dickens died 150 years ago, on 9th June 1870. He died of a stroke in Gad's Hill Place, his country home in Kent, when halfway through writing *The Mystery of Edwin Drood*. The last novel he completed – most of them were written in regularly released parts – was *Our Mutual Friend*, in 1865.

He was born in Portsmouth in 1812, the second of eight children, to a relatively poor family. He wrote 15 novels and was also a staunch social campaigner, particularly for children's rights and education.

Caring for the bereaved

The Church of England in Chester Diocese is launching a programme of additional support for people experiencing a family bereavement.

Bereaved families can still arrange Church of England funerals and, in addition, families will be offered the opportunity to organise a memorial or remembrance service at a time when we can freely meet again.

In normal times, the vicar would discuss with a bereaved family exactly how they would like to say goodbye. They would meet with them in person and discuss which music, Bible readings, and prayers they would like.

Much of this has not been able to happen because of restrictions limiting the length of a funeral. Social distancing measures have also reduced the number of people able to attend, and family members have been unable to hug and console each other, adding to their grief.

The Acting Bishop of Chester, the Rt Revd Keith Sinclair says we are living through an incredibly difficult time but urges people to know that the Church is there for them, whatever they may have been through, wherever they are.

"We are living through a profound moment for our nation and the world, the effects of which will be felt for a long time to come. "But the Church remains a constant Christian presence in every community and an anchor of hope for many. I would wish for everyone to know that the Church is here for you. Talk to us, we can help".

"Contact your local vicar if you would like to talk to us about arranging a funeral, memorial service or attending a remembrance service, and the Church is here for you if you simply want someone to listen to your story."

At Lower Peover, our Reader, Ann Barlow, is also licensed for bereavement ministry and is available to conduct funerals, particularly at this time when we have no vicar. She can be contacted on 01565 722989 or by email at hannbarlow@btopenworld.com if you would like to talk to her.

Knowing what needs doing, learning common sense. Handing out the staples when Dad's mending an old fence.


Learning to drive a tractor before you're even ten. You'll know when you are ready, no one can tell you when.






