### Thought for the Month.

Dear Friends,

I write to you this morning for the very first time as your new vicar. I had envisaged a very different kind of beginning to my ministry here in Peover, at the very least, imagining a jolly good bun fight with you all at the church or the vicarage!

Alas of course, I have arrived at a time of pandemic. A time when many of our best laid plans have to be changed at the drop of a hat and when we are all not only having to come to terms with doing things in very new or different ways. But perhaps also having to stop doing those things that were once routine, made us feel secure, comforted us or brought us Joy.

I myself having been in isolated lockdown for five months, far away from my previous parishes, my friends and family, am only too aware of the sense of loneliness and anxiety this disease has and continues to inflict on so many of us.

Yet, I do believe that there is hope!

As I sat in the vicarage study pondering what to say to you today, I was reminded of a Bible story that we read in Church recently.

Despite having been penned over two thousand years ago, it is a story that for me seems to resonate profoundly with the situation we as individuals, families, a parish, and a nation, currently face.

It is a lovely story about Saint Peter, who, surrounded by the ravages and darkness of a storm, steps out in great faith and begins to walk on the waters of a lake to get to Jesus.

Peter, being Peter however, quickly gets distracted and takes his eyes off his Lord, becomes overwhelmed by the storm and begins to sink into the waters.

Then (and this is the bit I love) Jesus, seeing his friend begin to waver, goes towards Peter, reaches out and calmly lifts him to safety.

In a way many of us may have felt or may now be feeling a little like Peter, shaken or overwhelmed by the current situation around us.

But this story I hope, will act as a gentle reminder to us all that despite our current state of unknowing, all the uncertainty, or our very real and understandable anxieties and fears, we are not alone.

Jesus, as he did all those years ago for Peter, is still (even if it is sometimes hard to see him through the wind and the rain of this current storm) walking alongside us through all the ups and downs of life, and stands firm on his promises to lovingly reach out and hold us safe even when we begin to lose heart.

So my friends, may I encourage us all to keep the faith today, these troubled waters will one day pass and until that day does finally come; I pray that we can all find some peace and reassurance in the knowledge that God is not only walking alongside us through these challenging times, but is, and will forever be, a safe and welcoming harbour for each one of us in this and every storm we face.

### **Resources for personal prayer**

While we may not be able to meet for regular worship there are many resources which we can use to maintain times of prayer and bible study.

**The Book of Common Prayer** offers prayers and readings for all occasions and the orders of Morning and Evening Prayer can be read aloud in one's own home. The Psalter which is included in the Book of Common Prayer identifies a psalm or selection of psalms for each day of the month.

### **Radio and television**

The BBC offers a **Daily Service** on Radio 4 Long Wave every day at 9.45am as well as **Sunday Worship** at 8.10am on Sunday mornings on Radio 4. There is **Choral Evensong** on Radio 3 every Wednesday at 3.30pm which is repeated on Sundays at 3.00pm. In addition, **Songs of Praise** is televised on BBC1 at 1.15pm on Sunday. Programmes are also available on BBC iPlayer or the BBC Sounds app.

### **Digital Resources**

There are several apps available for smartphones and tablets including the Church of England **Daily Prayer** app which offers Morning Prayer, Evening Prayer and Compline in either Contemporary or Traditional Language. **Time to Pray** similarly offers an Order for Prayer During The Day as well as an order for Night Prayer. The app **Pray as you go** offers a short daily audio meditation with music. The Church of England publishes a **Prayer for the Day** both as audio and text on its website as well as on several social media platforms. Many Church of England resources can be accessed through **smart speakers** such as Alexa or Google home by asking 'Alexa open The Church of England' or 'Hey Google, talk to the Church of England.' As well as answering questions, the apps can be asked to read a range of prayers along with such things as the Apostle's Creed and The Beatitudes.

**Chester Cathedral** will provide worship through online streaming at 5.30pm on Mondays, Tuesdays and Thursdays and at 10am on Sundays.

There are many Bible Study resources available as apps or on the web. The ones which we have mainly been using for Exploring the Word of God can be found on the following websites:

### Caring for the bereaved

The Church of England in Chester Diocese is launching a programme of additional support for people experiencing a family bereavement.

Bereaved families can still arrange Church of England funerals and, in addition, families will be offered the opportunity to organise a memorial or remembrance service at a time when we can freely meet again.

In normal times, the vicar would discuss with a bereaved family exactly how they would like to say goodbye. They would meet with them in person and discuss which music, Bible readings, and prayers they would like.

Much of this has not been able to happen because of restrictions limiting the length of a funeral. Social distancing measures have also reduced the number of people able to attend, and family members have been unable to hug and console each other, adding to their grief.

The Acting Bishop of Chester, the Rt Revd Keith Sinclair says we are living through an incredibly difficult time but urges people to know that the Church is there for them, whatever they may have been through, wherever they are.

"We are living through a profound moment for our nation and the world, the effects of which will be felt for a long time to come. "But the Church remains a constant Christian presence in every community and an anchor of hope for many. I would wish for everyone to know that the Church is here for you. Talk to us, we can help".

"Contact your local vicar if you would like to talk to us about arranging a funeral, memorial service or attending a remembrance service, and the Church is here for you if you simply want someone to listen to your story."

At Lower Peover, our Reader, Ann Barlow, is also licensed for bereavement ministry and is available to conduct funerals, particularly at this time when we have no vicar. She can be contacted on 01565 722989 or by email at <u>hannbarlow@btopenworld.com</u> if you would like to talk to her.

### Meditation on the Good Use of Sickness

Lord, you are good and gentle in all your ways; and your mercy is so great that not only the blessings but also the misfortunes of your people are channels of your compassion. Grant that I may turn to you as a Father in my present condition since the change in my own state from health to sickness brings no change to you. You are always the same, and you are my loving Father in times of trouble and in times of joy alike.

Being the office supervisor, I had to have a word with a new employee who never arrived at work on time. I explained that her tardiness was unacceptable and that other employees had noticed that she was walking in late every day.

After listening to my complaints, she agreed that this was a problem and even offered a solution. "Is there another door I could use?".

### He gave us eyes to see them: 'The Madonna of the Goldfinch' by Raphael

The weeks and months of lockdown have been difficult and testing times for many of us, but they have also provided the opportunity to look afresh at the world of nature. With less traffic on the roads, less air pollution, and less noise pollution, the sky has somehow seemed bluer and the bird song more joyful and confident.

It is appropriate that we focus this month on one such bird noted for its liquid, tinkling song - the goldfinch. In this month we also celebrate the feast of the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary on 8 September, and so the painting is 'The Madonna of the Goldfinch' by Raphael.


Raphael was only 37 years old when he died in 1520, but his work is marked by



maturity and great beauty. No more so than in this painting which shows Mary with a young Jesus and John the Baptist. You could easily miss the tiny bird which is carefully held by John and gently stroked by Jesus, who has one foot resting on His mother's. It is an intimate, tender scene which was painted in 1505 as a wedding gift for Lorenzo Nasi. It was badly damaged by an earthquake in 1548, painstakingly restored in the early part of this century, and now hangs in the Uffizi in Florence.

As we look, we rejoice in the grace and simplicity of the scene. We look again and ask ourselves 'Why a goldfinch?' The bird has a red spot on its head, and legend tells that the goldfinch flew down to the cross of Calvary to take a thorn from the crown of thorns. As it pulled the thorn in its beak, its head was splashed with a drop of blood.

And so this painting of gentleness and innocence opens out into a wider canvas of redemptive love. Our thoughts move from infancy to the cross. Mary, sat on a rock, is reading 'The Throne of Wisdom', and the artist is inviting us to ponder where true wisdom is found. Here, as we look at the wonder of nature and new life with a mother and children, but also as we look ahead to the 'wisest love' of Jesus who is our Redeemer.


